AP SCHOLAR AWARDS

The College Board's Advanced Placement Program offers students the opportunity to take challenging college level courses while in high school and receive college credit, advanced course placement, or both, for successful performance on the AP exams.

Students were administered the AP exams in May 2018 at the completion of each AP course. The College Board recognizes several levels of achievement based on students' performance on AP exams.

- Twenty-six students qualified for the **AP Scholar with Distinction Award** by earning an average of at least 3.5 on all their AP exams, and scores of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams. ACT PREP CLASS AT HIGH SCHOOL

Mt. Sinai High School will be offering an ACT prep course for Sophomores and Juniors. The course will be held at the High School on Mondays and Wednesdays from 7-9 P.M. A flyer will be mailed home with more information about registration and dates.

The course is being taught through Method Test Prep and will be designed to prepare students for the December ACT.

The course is designed to support individual learning styles and taught by top teachers. This course can also improve overall study skills and achievement.

Method Test Prep gives students the opportunity to get support from qualified test prep experts. It is geared towards students who are taking the ACT for the first time, and designed to give students the knowledge they need to get a better score.
