WHEREAS, the Board of Education of the Mount Sinai School District desires to embark upon various capital improvement projects at the Mount Sinai High School, Mount Sinai Middle School & Mount Sinai Elementary School, including modifications, replacement, upgrades and repairs to such building components, systems and spaces as Roofing, Masonry, Flooring, Ceilings, Exterior Entrance Renovations, Windows, Public Address System Upgrades, Lighting, Paving, Site Work, Interior Renovations, Science Labs, Electrical Distribution, Additions & alterations, Utilities, Doors & Hardware, Security, Plumbing, Toilet Renovations, HVAC, Ventilation, Exhaust & Controls, Air Handling Systems, Accessibility and

WHEREAS, said capital improvement projects at Mount Sinai High School, Mount Sinai

Middle School & Mount Sinai Elementary School are subject to classification under the State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA); and

WHEREAS, routine activities such as maintenance or repair involving no substantial changes in an existing structure or facility; and replacement, rehabilitation of a structure or facility, in kind, on the same site, including upgrading buildings to meet building or fire codes, unless such action meets or exceeds any of the thresholds in section 617.5 of this part; and

WHEREAS, the SEQR Regulations declare Type II Actions to be actions that have no significant impact on the environment and require no further review under SEQRA; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education, as the only involved agency, has examined all information related to the various capital improvement projects and has determined that said capital improvements, including modifications, replacement, upgrades and repairs to such building components, systems and spaces as Roofing, Masonry, Flooring, Ceilings, Exterior Entrance Renovations, Windows, Public Address System Upgrades, Lighting, Paving, Site Work, Interior Renovations, Science Labs, Electrical Distribution, Additions & Alterations, Utilities, Doors & Hardware, Security, Plumbing, Toilet Renovations, HVAC, Ventilation, Exhaust & Controls, Air Handling Systems, Accessibility at Mount Sinai High School, Mount Sinai Middle School & Mount Sinai Elementary School are classified as a Type II Action pursuant to Section 617.5 (1,2) of the SEQRA Regulations;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education hereby declares itself lead agency in connection with the requirements of the State Environmental Quality Review Act; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education hereby declares that the capital improvement projects including modifications, replacement, upgrades and repairs to such building components, systems and spaces as Roofing, Masonry, Flooring, Ceilings, Exterior Entrance Renovations, Windows, Public Address System Upgrades, Lighting, Paving, Site Work, Interior Renovations, Science Labs, Electrical Distribution, Additions & Alterations, Utilities, Doors & Hardware, Security, Plumbing, Toilet Renovations, HVAC, Ventilation, Exhaust & Controls, Air Handling Systems, Accessibility at Mount Sinai High School, Mount Sinai Middle School & Mount Sinai Elementary School are a Type II Action, which requires no further review under SEQRA; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Education hereby shall forward an official copy of this Resolution to the New York State Education Department together with a copy of the correspondence from the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation in connection with its request for approval of the listed projects from the New York State Education Department.
